



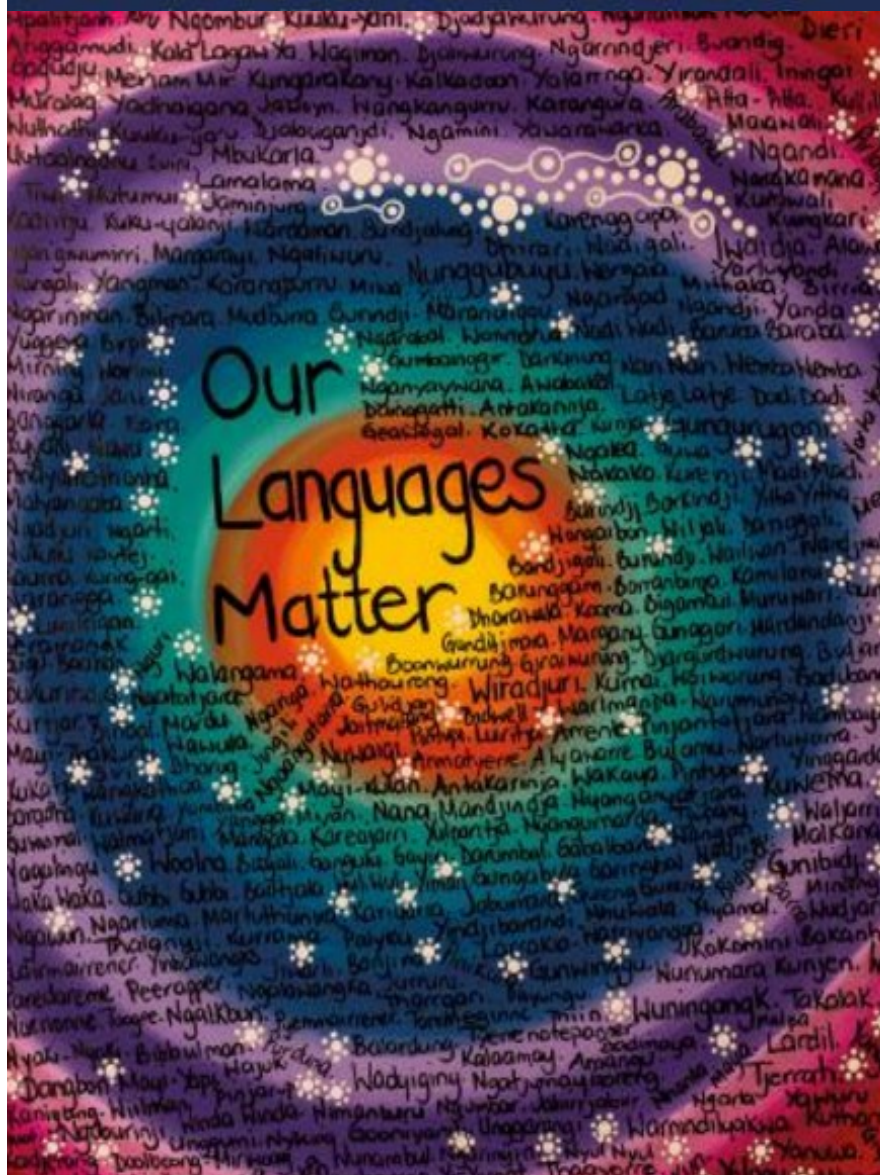

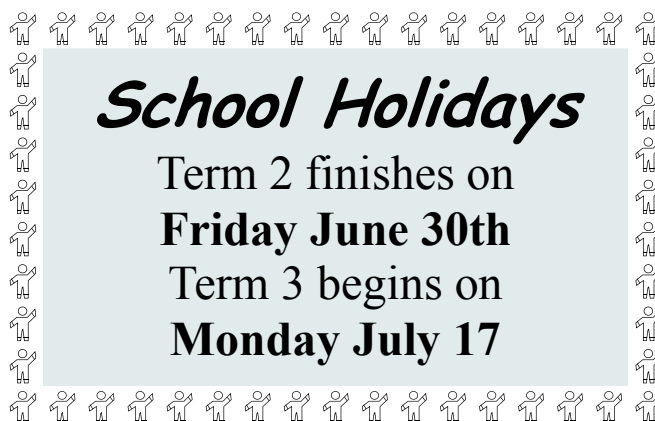

Value of Trust

We are continuing to focus on the value of TRUST till the end of the term.

Our Holy Family, Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, teaches us **Trust in God and the importance of trusting each other.**

Mary, Joseph and Jesus faced many challenges in their life as a family. For example, in Mt 2:13-15 Jesus' life is in danger from King Herod. Upon hearing the news from an angel, Joseph had to gather his wife and son and flee to Egypt. They had to leave their native soil to go as strangers to a foreign land. Yet they go; and they go with trust in God's word and with trust in each other. The loving relationship among the three members of the Holy Family together show us the importance of trust in building and developing positive relationships.

Take a moment to discuss Trust with your child/ren. Remind them that Trust is not just about not taking things that belong to others, but being reliable and dependable, using good judgements and to act fairly.

What does Trust mean?

The students in Year 1 at Holy Family say Trust is....

- * Not stealing (Eden)
- * Doing the right thing (Hailey)
- * Telling your teacher and being good (Harrison)
- * Being able to keep a secret for your friend (Jasper)
- * Doing the right thing and tell the truth (Magnus)
- * Being someone who will not let a friend fall (Taylah)
- * Being there for my friend and help them. (Chloe and Leila)
