The Learning Corner



Growth Mindset in Mathematics

A growth mindset is the belief that intelligence or 'smartness' can be learned and that the brain grows from experience and effort.

Did you know that praising efforts rather than intelligences or results could impact your child's ability to persevere in challenges! The goal is to have children thrive on challenges and see mistakes as learning opportunities. Brain research tells us that making mistakes actually wires more connections into the brain.

When a person has a growth mindset, they accept challenges, see their efforts as worthwhile and are open to learning from mistakes.

How can you help? Some simple ways:

- Adding "yet" when they claim they are "not good at this" (Respond: "You are not good at this yet.")
- Ask questions that focus on their effort and choices and get them to reflect on the satisfaction of that effort. (e.g. What did you learn today? What mistake did you make that taught you something? What did you try hard at today? What will you try hard at to-morrow?)
- Model this yourself as you share about your own day.

As a parent if you are randomly-selected to complete the survey, I would encourage your participation as this will help our school to identify our strengths and areas in which we can focus our improvement.


Parents have been sent home a paper survey but will also be able to complete the survey online if preferred. The survey will take about 20-30 minutes to complete.



HOLY WEEK

Holy Week commemorates Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem; his gift of the Eucharist; and his suffering, death, and Resurection.

Holy Week is a time of final preparations and great anticipation. Our long-term preparations of prayers, fasting, and almsgiving luring Lent will continue but with greater intensity. Palm Sunday is our doorway into the holiest week of the Church year. The hree solemn liturgies on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday (Easter Vigil) are called the Triduum.

Holy means "set apart." Christians set apart an entire week - Holy Week - to recall the events surrounding the suffering, death, and Resurrection of Jesus.

During this week let us unite through prayer to reflect on and act on the events of Holy Week While on the cross in the midst of suffering and agony Jesus calls out to his Father:

Father, forgive them for they do not know what they are doing. Luke 23:34

Jesus' forgiveness has no limits:
In knowing that Jesus suffered, died and rose from the dead for us;
How can we respond in our own thoughts and actions to this gospel message?

May we be immersed in the mercy of Christ so we may forgive as Christ has forgiven.
