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The Learning Corner



Communicating with Children Using Mathematical Language Talking About Mathematics:

Talking about Mathematics with your child – whatever his or her age – helps strengthen his or her mathematical reasoning and understanding. Some ways to keep the talk engaged and focused while you support your child include:

- ◆ **Revoice** - Repeat what you heard your child say, then ask for clarification (e.g., “So you are saying it’s an odd number?”).
- ◆ **Repeat/Restate** – Ask your child to restate your reasoning (e.g., “Can you repeat what I said in your own words?”).
- ◆ **Reason** – Ask your child to apply his or her own reasoning to someone else’s reasoning (e.g., “Do you agree or disagree? Tell me why.”).
- ◆ **Adding On** – Prompt your child to participate further (e.g., “What more would you add to that?”).
- ◆ **Think Time** – Wait several seconds (try five) to give your child time to think (e.g., “Take some time to think.”). You may be surprised by how hard it is to stay silent in that time!

Attendance at School

In June you will be receiving your child's report. The number of days your child was absent will be recorded on the report. It is amazing the number of parents who are shocked when they see the number of days missed by their children. Every minute missed by your child potentially has an impact in his/her education. Also if your child is late for school we are legally bound to record the time he/ she arrives. This happens even if your child arrives 3 minutes late. If you are not with your child we send home a letter each Monday to give you the opportunity to explain so that the recording is not an unexplained absence. Thank you to those parents who make sure that this letter is returned each week. Please remember also that school begins at **8.55am**.

We ask that you make a big effort to get your child to school on time every day and to make sure that they do not stay away unless he/ she has a very good reason. If your child reaches a number of unexplained absences we have to report this fact to Community and Family Services.



Introducing the Holy Family Cow!

Our cow, who is yet to be named, joined us on the first day back at school this term as part of Dairy Australia's Picasso Cows program. The program is designed to teach children about where dairy foods come from and the health benefits of consuming dairy foods such as milk, cheese and yogurt.

'From Farm to Plate' is the learning focus for our cow, which will see it transformed from a blank life-size fibreglass cow, into a piece of art with an important educational message! We have held a design and naming competition and will be announcing the winners next week.



Feast of Pentecost

Last Sunday we celebrated the feast of Pentecost, 'pente' meaning fifty. It was exactly fifty days since the resurrection of Jesus. Pentecost is also known as the birthday of the Church as the Holy Spirit gave the disciples courage to speak about Jesus to the world. The following scripture passage came from last Sunday's gospel.

Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

In the evening of the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.'

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

After reading this scripture passage, students at Holy Family would have been asked three questions in the lesson:

- ◆ What I 'see'? - I can retell the Scripture passage, I can answer the questions, who? What? When? Where? Why?
- ◆ What are the 'messages'? - I can identify Christ and the Sacraments, I can identify themes and messages
- ◆ How can I 'live' these messages? - I can live Jesus' message, I can respond to the teachings of the Church, I can live our Holy Family values of Respect, Responsibility, Compassion, Trust and Forgiveness

Reading the scripture passage to your child and then asking them the questions will help with the learning in the classroom.
