Student Management.



**Project Based Learning Framework in Year Three**

In Year 3 we are learning to inform others on familiar and unfamiliar topics. During Science, we are using the Project Based Learning (PBL) framework to develop an end product in response to the driving question: **How can we as scientists (ecologists), evaluate and inform other students about how our actions affect other living things?**

We are researching different ecosystems in the rainforests and composing informative texts about the relationship between living and nonliving things in these environments.

Here is a snapshot of the wonderful learning that is happening in Year Three.

Rainforests have survived for over millions of years. There are many different species of trees, some approximately 200 feet tall. Many birds have made homes in the canopy of the tallest trees. The understorey only receives 2-15% of sunlight, which makes it a very dark and damp place with many young trees and leafy plants that need very little light. The bottom of the rainforest is called the forest floor. There are many layers of leaf matter which is the home for many living organisms that live together such as moss, fungi and insects.

The Heart of the Rainforest.

Ecosystems are made up of biotic and abiotic components, which simply means living and nonliving things. Living things can be organised into flora (plant-life) and fauna (animal-life).

The rainforests have existed for millions of years and have survived many things. There are trees that can grow up to 200 feet tall. As the cold air blows in off the ocean, humidity builds over the forest. The canopy serves as a home for birds. Millions of living organisms compete for light beneath the canopy. Beneath the canopy the air is humid and damp.

Volunteers needed to help with wrapping of the gifts.



