'Good Friday'

I would like to share Good Friday's reading with you. Maybe you would like to take time to reflect on this. Personally, I always wondered how Jesus planned for his mother to be cared for after his death...

The Crucifixion of Jesus John (19:16-27)

So the soldiers took charge of Jesus. Carrying his own cross, he went out to the place of the Skull (which in Aramaic is called Golgotha). There they crucified him, and with him two others—one on each side and Jesus in the middle.

Pilate had a notice prepared and fastened to the cross. It read: Jesus of Nazareth, the king of the jews. Many of the Jews read this sign, for the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city, and the sign was written in Aramaic, Latin and Greek. The chief priests of the Jews protested to Pilate, "Do not write 'The King of the Jews,' but that this man claimed to be king of the Jews."

Pilate answered, "What I have written, I have written."

When the soldiers crucified Jesus, they took his clothes, dividing them into four shares, one for each of them, with the undergarment remaining. This garment was seamless, woven in one piece from top to bottom.

"Let's not tear it," they said to one another. "Let's decide by lot who will get it."

This happened that the scripture might be fulfilled that said,

"They divided my clothes among them and cast lots for my garment."

So this is what the soldiers did.

Near the cross of Jesus stood his mother, his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother there, and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to her, "Woman, here is your son," and to the disciple, "Here is your mother." From that time on, this disciple took her into his home.

Holy Week Celebrations

This week all grades across the school experienced the journey of Jesus to the cross and tomb this Holy Week. Teachers took students to a prayer space that was set up and students prayed and learnt about:

Palm Sunday - Jesus' entry into Jerusalem

The Washing of the Feet - Jesus' most powerful message about serving others

The Last Supper - Jesus' last meal with his disciples

The Stations of the Cross - Jesus' path to crucifixion, death and burial

I would like to thank all children for partaking in this special celebration and prayer. Please ask your child about what they remember about this week and their experiences. I'm sure that they will be able to share some amazing knowledge.

Message From the AP

Focus on Counting

During this term teachers and students have been focusing on improving knowledge and skills around counting. Teachers have been tracking progress and are now looking at data to see improvements children have made in this area.

During this week we will be looking at how well this strategy has worked and I look forward to reporting back to you after the break with some pleasing news.

Counting is a necessary life skill. It is part of our daily life. This was very evident to me while I was completing my weekly shopping and I overheard a mum asking her child to get 6 tomatoes. A simple task which develops confidence in Mathematical skills as well as the child's self esteem and independence.

Personal Development and Health (PDH)

During 2020 Holy Family looked at a program for PDH which could be implemented across the school that linked to NSW Syllabus outcomes and built on worthwhile skills from K-6.

It is a program that looks at social-emotional learning and maximises success, positive relationships and wellbeing. Online resources help our school to support children who may experience anxiety, low self-esteem, anger and procrastination.

The program is called "You Can Do it!" Across the school each grade will investigate and discuss the following topics:

- resilience
- confidence
- persistence
- organisation
- getting along

The program promotes social-emotional wellbeing. It develops and strengthens a rational mindset which can lead to reductions in student's emotional and behavioural problems and increases in their positivity, achievement and wellbeing.

2021 NAPLAN

Last week Holy Family students in Years 3 and 5 participated in a coordinated practice test on Thursday.

A large number of schools from around Australia participated, which provided a successful test of the online assessment platform performance under high load.

Students in both grades have been familiarised with the types of questions that will be seen on the actual NAPLAN test which will begin on 12 May. Parents were given information about the Public website which allows parents the opportunity to also view the platform.


Library
