In early 2021, our school, along with thousands of others across the country will begin preparations for the fifth Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC gives us a national picture of the development, health and wellbeing of children in their first year of full-time school. Since 2009, the census results have helped communities, schools and governments plan services and develop better policies to target support for children and families.

Children don't miss any class time, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information for the census. The AEDC gives us data at a school and community level it isn't an assessment of individual children.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.

Transport: Buses will leave school 9:15am to arrive at the oval by 9.30am

What to bring and wear:

- Students may wear a shirt in their House colour with school sports pants and school hat, otherwise full school uniform. Please also make sure your child's name and class is clearly marked on all items of clothing.
- Ample healthy food and drink as the canteen will only be available to parents.

Message From the AP

During last term teachers focused on the specific skill of counting during the Mathematics block. The focus was targeted during the warm-up, which is the beginning of the session. The children were all involved in activities which moved them onto the next step in their understanding of counting. Depending on the age/grade of the child it may mean counting past 30 or being able to skip count by 3s or 7s from a given number.

The skill of counting is part of life. Therefore, during planning, teachers used tasks which were related to real life and where students could transfer their knowledge of counting to problem solving. Using counting to solve number problems shows children that counting can be used meaningfully in a variety of situations.

During this time teachers collected different types of data and kept track of student progress. At the end of the term we were able to celebrate successes as we looked at the data and compared it to understanding earlier in the term. Teachers discussed how students counting skills helped them in other mathematical understanding. They were able to apply counting to practical tasks, were confident with new mathematical language and built independence by checking their own answers.

We are currently working together on improving Comprehension skills across the school. I look forward to sharing our progress with you.

Every year a picture book, written and illustrated by an Australian author and illustrator, is read simultaneously in libraries, schools, pre-schools, family homes, bookshops and many other places around the country. This year THE NSS took place on Wednesday 19 May 2021 from the International Space Station and Holy Family joined over one million other students by listening to the story *'Give Me Some Space' written and illustrated by Philip Bunting*.

Students extended on that fun by exploring the themes of the book such as, Space exploration; astronomy; science; inventiveness; passion; the solar system; Earth; environmental conservation; hope; wonder; perspectives and viewpoints.

- promote an Australian writer and publisher
- promote storytime activities




